1. Welcome and Introductions –Meeting was called to order at 11:41 by John Klein.  
Members Present: John Klein- JCCB, Jeanette Shoop-Horizons, Melissa Walker-Project Director, Phil & Lavonne Owen, Bill Feldmann, Lynette Otten-LSI, Amy Doerrfeld-JCSHY/ASAC, Kelly Schmidt-ASAC, Keith Dirks-Co. Supervisor, Carrie Johnson-ASAC Counselor, Kris Kilburg-CPPC, Dawn Grassfield, Bob George, Bob Simonson- APD, Kelly Dodge, Teresa Marek, and Phil Parsons-Co. Atty.-16 members present; 2 coalition staff present.
2. Approval of January Minutes- motion by Kelly Dodge, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bill Feldmann, motion carried unanimously.
3. Celebrations for past month: See flip chart paper! \*Alcohol Compliance Checks! - All establishments that were checked passed this most recent check. We will be working with local law enforcement to come up with a plan to continue this. Bob Simonson expressed interest in conducting additional checks through Anamosa Police Department in the future.
4. Committee Updates (Join a committee! Still need more Outreach Committee members.)
  - a. Policy- Social Host Ordinance- Feb. public hearing date- John K. - Final version was presented. It will be sent to the Board of Supervisors. Marketing Committee will be contacted to promote this within the community so they can be present when the Supervisors review the ordinance.
  - b. Planning- final Rx Drug plan for folders, other- Kelly D. /Phil P. Assessment subcommittee for those interested after new IYS comes out. Meeting was held for Midland MS mixer and they are looking for a couple more volunteers for childcare.
  - c. Fundraising- Jeanette- They are looking at raising funds for youth activities, and long term sustainability. An Endowment grant was applied for, as well as researching other funding sources. They are looking for ways to raise money for a youth event planned for April 20 (4/20) which has been internationally recognized as “pot Smoking” day. If anyone has any unused games or activities to donate, please contact Jennifer. It was suggested to contact Rockwell about their used computer donation program. Phil also encouraged others to look for outside funding sources through grants and other areas, so we can build sustainability. Obtaining 501(c)3 status was also discussed.

- d. Marketing- Amy reported that each establishment that passed compliance check will be receiving an “award” from JCSHY Coalition to display. Coalition is waiting on flip calendars to arrive before “awards” are presented.
  - e. BEASTS- Day on the Hill, Amy gave update- 18 students from Midland, Monticello, and Anamosa went with 6 adults to meet senators and reps, and sit in on sessions about importance of preventing substance abuse. Teresa Marek went too and got a chance to share stories of effects of substance abuse on families. JEL came to Monti and Midland to give tobacco prevention info to kids during the school day, speaking to younger kids- our intern Ashley gave a presentation to 8<sup>th</sup> grade students in Monticello about how substance abuse has affected her, and was well received. Jennifer will get more presentations lined up in other Middle Schools in the county.
  - f. Special events- updated calendar, Mixers-sign-up sheets- Midland Feb. 24, Monticello HS- March 3- handouts were distributed with this info.

5. Treasurer’s report- Kelly \$182.52 mileage, \$250 on marketing, \$17.10 travel
  6. DFC Continuation Application for FY11, budget and action plan approval needed- Melissa Walker presented updates on our action plan and revised budget that needs to be submitted for FY12. The Ad Hoc committee has been working on this and has presented recommendations. The proposed plans were sent with agenda for members to review. Motion to approve FY 12 JCSHY Coalition DFC budget by Bill Feldmann, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Keith Dirks motion carried unanimously.  
Motion to approve Year 4 Action plan by Bill Feldmann, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Keith Dirks, motion carried unanimously.
  7. Tobacco coalition designation recommendation- vote- John reported that Exec committee recommends approving this designation. 2004 tobacco-less coalition dissolved and 3 county Breathe Easy formed, but no one from Jones County attended, except ASAC Prevention Specialist. Action by Breathe easy includes Mercy Counseling, JEL, and IDPH all had outside grant money for activities. JCSHY is currently working on Tobacco prevention in county. Motion to approve JCSHY Coalition as designated Jones County tobacco Coalition with the stipulation that if any requirements or stipulations are made of the coalition due to this designation in the future that the designation can be re-visited by Keith Dirks, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bill Feldmann, motion carried.
  8. Training survey-an updated user friendly survey will come out soon via electronic format and hard copy for those who don’t have computer access.
  9. Coalition survey- Survey Gizmo still open OR paper copy available today if you haven’t filled one out

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10. Other sharing- Jones County Fair – costs last year included \$496 to have a booth and volunteer passes. It was reported that there was a lot of manpower for a booth without a huge impact. We currently have \$1200 budgeted for fair this FY 11. Motion to have policy committee review use of funds to increase environmental strategies to improve conditions with preventing underage youth access to alcohol and unapproved use, not funding for a booth by Phil Parsons, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Keith Dirks, motion carried unanimously.

Lori Reynolds sent update from Washington D.C. She said conference workshops are doing a great job of tying substance abuse to other fields such as how it is impacting mental health. She is also contacting state legislators personally and updating them on issues we are facing locally, and how the DFC and SAMSHA \$ is helping, and what gaps there are. John reported article in paper regarding substance use. Also updates on Synthetic drug K2 spice. It was reported that it is in our county and to be aware of it.

Motion by Phil Owen to adjourn, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bob Simonson, motion carried unanimously.
