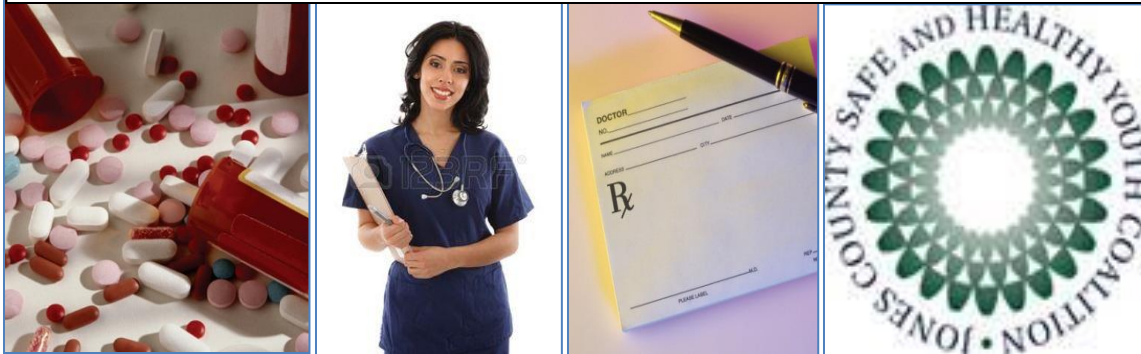


Prescription Drug Diversion

Course subject matter/purpose:

This course will help define prescription drug diversion for nurses and paramedics. The course will include case studies and discuss what steps to prevent diversion within an institution or agency. The course is intended to address the “Why, What, Who, How, and Where” of diversion of controlled substances and high value medications. The course focuses on legitimate access, developing strong policy and identifying sources of internal theft and diversion.
